# New in 2025

## Joining Forces with Liberty Place and Western Montana Mental Health Center

Last year, AWARE made changes to our service lines by combining forces with Liberty Place and Western Montana Mental Health Center to ensure the long-term sustainability of services for those seeking behavioral and mental healthcare in Montana. Adding Liberty Place expands the reach of people affected by brain injury. It was a natural extension of our mission, allowing us to provide even more comprehensive support to individuals striving for greater independence while honoring Liberty Place's legacy.



In May, AWARE and WMMHC announced the acquisition of WMMHC's services to build a stronger organization that will offer a comprehensive range of mental health, disability, and early intervention support. Although some aspects of our original plan changed, AWARE's dedication to WMMHC's staff and clients remained unchanged.

In 2025, we onboarded nearly all of WMMHC's staff, clients, and programs. Some transitions occurred quickly, while others are taking more time to ensure we do things at the highest quality. We understand the urgent need for mental health, substance use, and behavioral support, and we remain committed to doing what we can to maintain and even expand access across the state.





# Who We Are & What We Do

**AWARE is Montana's trusted nonprofit leader for community-based care.**

Many identify AWARE as an organization serving individuals with disabilities, serving children, adults, and families, guiding them through life's challenges and celebrating their victories, and that is a big part of what we do. But we've also grown and expanded our services because the path to independence affects people of all types in every community.

We've never wavered from our mission to help people live independent lives. Whether mental health services, Early Head Start, homeless support programs, vocational programs, or early intervention, AWARE provides a place where all are welcomed, supported, and empowered.



# Our Services >>>>>>>

- \* **Adult and Youth Residential Services** provides community-based living services, group homes, and supported living programs for adults with developmental disabilities, mental health challenges, and medical needs. We also offer residential care for children and teens with mental health challenges, developmental disabilities, or autism.
- \* **Applied Behavior Analysis** supports individuals facing behavioral challenges, autism spectrum disorder, emotional disturbances, and developmental disabilities.
- \* **Brain Injury Services** provides residential settings in Whitehall, for individuals who receive 24/7 personalized care, skill-building programs, and meaningful activities.
- \* **Care Coordination and Case Management** coordinates physical and mental health care, assesses individual needs, creates care plans, and connects individuals to services.
- \* **Center for Excellence** is a private school in Anaconda, helping children of all ages and abilities reach their full potential.
- \* **Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic** provides mental health and substance use services, ensuring high-quality care for underserved populations.



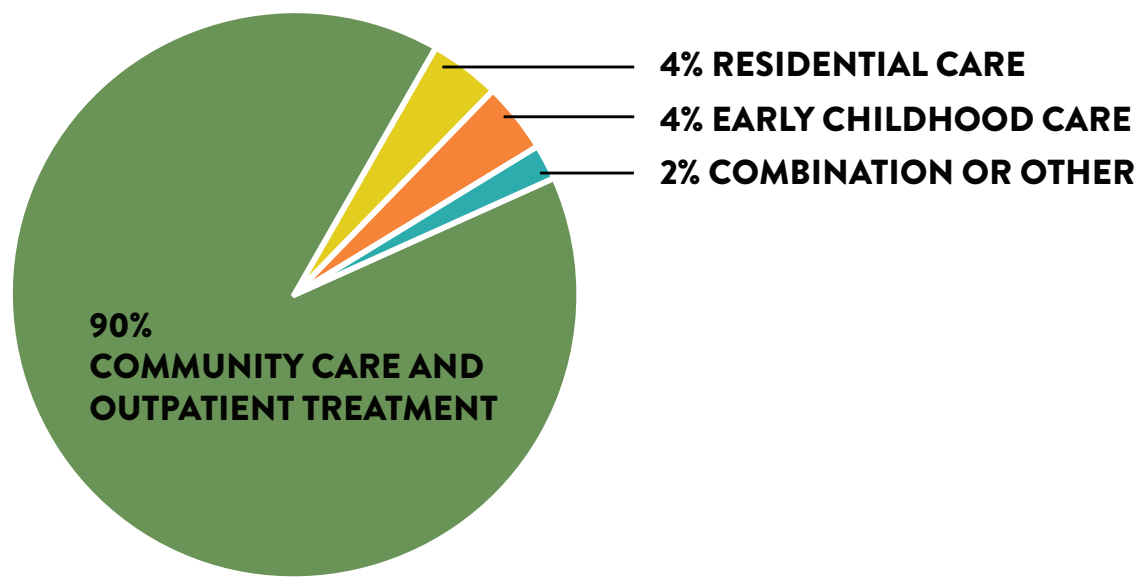
- \* **Children's Advocacy Center** in Lewis and Clark County provides a safe, supportive space and a multidisciplinary group of experts who evaluate cases of abuse and support affected children and families.
- \* **Crisis Intervention** provides immediate, compassionate support to access urgent mental health care, crisis counseling, or connection to resources.
- \* **Developmental Disability Services** helps individuals build independence and achieve goals with personalized support and guidance.
- \* **Early Head Start** provides early childhood education for underserved children and their families from birth to age 3 in Butte, Whitehall, Helena, Belgrade, and Billings.
- \* **Individual, Group, and Family Therapy** are outpatient services that include case management, home support services, applied behavior analysis, and therapy.
- \* **Home Support Services** assists individuals in finding and maintaining stable housing while receiving the treatment they need.
- \* **Medication Management and Psychiatric Services** for adults and youth, supporting individuals with mental health concerns, our team develops a personalized treatment plan through in-person visits or telepsychiatry.

- \* **Mental Health Adult Day Treatment** helps people manage their mental health symptoms and develop skills and knowledge to achieve or maintain independent living.
- \* **PACT - Program for Assertive Community Treatment** offers 24/7 community-focused care for adults with severe mental illnesses who struggle with traditional outpatient treatment.
- \* **PATH - Projects for Assistance in Transition from Homelessness** offers a range of support to individuals with serious mental illness who are experiencing or at risk of homelessness.
- \* **School-Based Services** provides school-based mental health services to help children overcome challenges, build confidence, and succeed academically and socially.
- \* **Social Skills Squad** is a school-based program in Helena guiding enrolled children through life's social challenges with care and compassion.
- \* **Substance Use Counseling** provides licensed addiction counselors who offer individual, group, and family support, ensuring you get the care you need.
- \* **Therapeutic Recreation Services** provides a supportive, evidence-based approach to improving your physical, mental, and social well-being.

# Karen Grows Stronger through Art



When Karen started with AWARE, she faced challenges with social skills, self-esteem, depression, and mania. She lost her motivation to pursue artistic endeavors and to embrace her identity as an artist.

Through the PACT program, she was able to access therapists, case management, medication management, and peer support. She worked hard on her treatment and mental health, and with support, she regained the self-esteem and strength needed to build a meaningful relationship with her partner, Pablos.

Karen has become a key member of our weekly Art Group, always motivating both clients and staff to explore their creative sides. She describes herself as “creatively pushy,” inspiring those around her to discover their artistic potential.

Sometimes, Karen struggles to stay motivated to paint. When that happens, she works with her case manager to process her feelings and regain focus, and they set small, achievable goals together.

Recently, Karen showcased her artwork in her first gallery exhibition. She also presented her art at the Helena Open House with AWARE staff, clients, and community members.

Reflecting on her journey, Karen shared, “I would not have had the support I needed without the PACT team. They respected my decisions and offered help whenever I needed it. My support staff has been instrumental in helping me reach my goals.”

Karen hopes others will see more of who she is, a fantastic artist, community member, partner, and more.

We are so proud of Karen and the progress she has made.

There are also larger organization milestones that show how we've risen to meet the challenges ahead, grown, touched lives, and shaped a brighter future for individuals, families, and communities across Montana.

## OUR JOURNEY

**1974**

A group of parents in Anaconda wanted to develop employment opportunities for their children with disabilities.

**1976**

AWARE is officially incorporated as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit.

**1980**

Achieved CARF accreditation, a testament to our commitment to providing the highest quality care.

**1998**

Awarded Early Head Start funding and opened the first center in Butte, providing families with the support they need for healthy early childhood development.

**2010**

Pioneered Montana's first residential autism services, ensuring no family feels alone.



**1990**

Expanded to serve youth in residential care, making a broader impact in the lives of Montana's children.

**2000**

Began offering case management services, supporting individuals and families on their journey toward independence



**2014**

Opened the Center for Excellence in Anaconda, a space dedicated to education, support, and growth for those with developmental disabilities.





**2018**

Launched Program for Assertive Community Treatment (PACT), bringing intensive mental health support directly to those in need, fostering stability and well-being in the community.



**2023**

Earned Cognia accreditation for the Center for Excellence, a symbol of our dedication to providing exceptional educational opportunities and care.

**2024**

Began Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic pilot project located in Helena, expanding barrier-free services to those in need of mental and behavioral healthcare.



**2025**

Acquired Liberty Place and Western Montana Mental Health Center's services and programs to ensure critical services remain for the people who need them.

**2026**

Celebrate 50 years of transforming lives and fostering independence for those with disabilities.



**2021**

Started Family Assertive Community Treatment (FACT) services to empower families to heal, grow, and thrive together, providing strength and resilience in challenging times.

**AWARE's growth demonstrates the strong partnerships we've built in local communities.**
